

Welcome to the June Good Oil

The committee met again recently to discuss its plans for the remainder of the year. Here's a rough outline of what committee discussed:

KHANACROSS

With two rounds of the 2018 Khanacross Series run and won, three rounds remain. They will be held at Carboor on July 22, August 19 and September 23 so mark the dates in your diary, come along and support those who put these events on as they're always a lot of fun.

Mt POREPUNKAH RALLYSPRINT

The wheels are already in motion for one of the club's most popular events, the Mt. Porepunkah Rallysprint which is scheduled for Saturday September 8. This event, which has been a popular inclusion on our rally calendar for a number of years, requires strong support from members to ensure that it runs to the usual high standard that is expected of the North Eastern Car Club. A permit has already been applied for and a start made on getting the event on the road (well, the road over Mt Porepunkah at least). If you're thinking of competing keep the date free as it's a round of the Rallysprint Series. If not, we are always looking for people to help with the 101 jobs that need doing. BETHANGA RALLYSPRINT

The Albury – Wodonga Car Club have calandered their Bethanga rallysprint for Saturday October 13 as part of the Riverina/North East Rallysprint series. Committee hasn't received any further information at this stage but we will keep you up to date as soon as we get more information.

WILBY LAP DASH

The committee have decided to run another Lap Dash at the popular little bitumen circuit on Sunday October 28. It's a while since we've been to Wilby and there's a good deal of interest being shown by those members who fancy a few fast blasts around the track. Again we keep on stressing that officials and helpers are just as important as competitors so your help would be greatly appreciated. Of course if you would rather compete, you're most welcome to do that. Ron Woodward is the man to talk to if you need more information. Supplementary Regulations (or Supp. Regs. for short) and entry forms will be available on the net very soon. It should be a great event.

CHROME BUMPER RUNS

These low-key Sunday runs have proved popular in the past so tentative plans are for two more of them before the end of the year. Several members have expressed interest in organizing a run or two and we'll have a better idea of where and when in the next month or so. Committee would like to see shorter events – around 125 – 150 kilometres as some of the older classic vehicles struggle a bit on long runs. Of course these runs aren't just for chrome-bumpered vehicles, any type of roadworthy car is eligible. We particularly encourage members with red-plated cars to join us for a tour around some of the interesting country in our area. Given good weather these social runs are a good way of meeting other members with similar interests.

There was some discussion at our last committee meeting about organizing a working bee in the near future to replace the two kitchen doors with new solid doors, door jambs and fittings. We've been putting off the replacement of these doors for years now which is compromising the security of our building. Naturally the job would need to be started and completed on the same day. But we need some help so if you're handy with a bit of joinery and can spare a few hours please talk to one of our committee members.

John Bell is the man to talk to regarding the Wangaratta Community raffle which we have agreed to be part of again this year. He has 50 books of tickets to distribute so we urge you to grab a couple of books and start selling. The club have been part of the raffle for the last couple of years and we make good money out of it. Please make an effort – tickets are easy to sell and are a great fundraiser. Tickets will be available from "Belly" at the next general meeting.

We're always looking for interesting spots to visit to supplement our normal monthly meetings. Last month's visit to the automotive instrument workshop at Markwood was new and fascinating – I always say that there are loads of interesting places around the north east (museums, car collections, workshops etc) that are well worth visiting again or for the first time. To this end we are looking at visiting the Brad Jones V8 Supercar workshop later this year and are seeking suggestions from members as to other places of interest that would be worth a visit. The club is presently experiencing a period of great growth and boasts its highest membership numbers since its inception, however to maintain this growth we need an enthusiastic and committed person to take the club into the future.

We believe we are the oldest car club in Victoria and possibly Australia and have a rich 65-year history in motorsport that dates back to 1953. However to maintain that history we need a dedicated person – male or female – to both guide us as President until the end of this year and also work toward leading the club in 2019 and possibly beyond.

Please Note

At the time of compiling this list VicRoads had not mailed out permit renewals for July or August and appeared unable to give a date when this would happen. If your permit is due for renewal and you have not received a renewal form you can visit a VicRoads office and they will print out a renewal for you, or you can wait until a renewal arrives in the mail. Please do not use your vehicle if your current permit has expired, not receiving a renewal is not an excuse for using your vehicle and if you are pulled over you will receive a very hefty fine.

CLUB PERMIT SIGNING

Both club permit applications and renewals will only be signed in one of the following two ways:

1. During the hour prior to commencement of either a monthly general meeting (first Wednesday of the month) or monthly committee meeting (third Wednesday of the month). Meetings start at 7.30 PM in non-daylight saving time and 8.00 PM in daylight saving time.
2. Sent by mail to Ron Woodward at 28 Lauriston Avenue Milawa VIC 3678. Renewals must include vehicle condition report form (download form from club web site) and a stamped self-addressed envelope. Due to longer mail delivery times, please allow 2-week turnaround time.

Note - please contact **Ron Woodward** [5727 3407] to organise signing of renewals.

Please note new conditions effective from
1st of January 2018:

- New members to the club **will not** be eligible to put a vehicle on the scheme.
- Existing members prior to above date will remain eligible to place a vehicle (or vehicles) on the scheme
- New applications (see conditions above) will only be processed at the clubrooms in the hour prior to commencement of a general or committee meeting.
- Permit renewals shall be signed prior to meetings as above or they can be sent by mail to Ron Woodward at 28 Lauriston Ave Milawa 3678 complete with vehicle condition report (form can be downloaded from club website) and a stamped self-addressed envelope. Please allow 2-week turnaround time due to slow mail deliveries now in force.
- Appointments for Ron to sign renewals at home will no longer be available.

CLUB PERMIT SCHEME NOTICE:

If your car is on the Club Permit Scheme and you don't renew your club membership on the due date, your registration will be automatically **INVALIDATED**. Your car is essentially unregistered if you are not a paid up financial member of the car club.

Cody Wins Nissan Nightmoves VCRS round

Second generation rally driver, Cody Richards (NECC), took a thrilling five second victory in the 2018 Nissan Nightmoves Rally, the second round of the Victorian Club Rally Series.

Driving a Ford Escort with new co-driver, Matthew Dillon sitting alongside, Richards overcame an early 10 second time penalty to beat home veterans Brian Semmens and Dan Parry in their Nissan 200SX.

It made up for the disappointment of round one of the VCRS for Richards, when his Escort suffered electrical problems before the first stage even got underway.

In cold and dusty conditions around Heathcote in central Victoria, the event attracted 41 entries.

Daryl King and Chris Barrett brought their Toyota home in third, with Joel Wald (Stanza) and Justin Lange (Escort) rounding out the top five.

The leading retirement was Jason Lennane (NECC) in his Proton Satria, who hit a tree on the third of the event's seven stages.

KHANACROSS Sun, 3 June

You'd be very hard pressed to get a more perfect day for a khanacross (or any motorsport event for that matter) than Sunday June 3. Not only was the weather perfect but the track at the Carboor Recreation Ground was dust-free and challenging. Mix in the hospitality provided by the Carboor locals and a good field of entrants, this khanacross was eagerly awaited by the small-ish but enthusiastic list of drivers. Most of the usual leadfoots were entered, several having come some distance to compete, and there was a good showing of juniors who would fight it out for junior honours.

With scrutineering taken care of by Ralph Scalzo, the first of six runs for the day got underway and it was obvious that the pace was certain to be on from the first flag-drop. While most of the seniors fought outright honours amongst themselves, the juniors had their own contest, putting in some pretty competitive times and gradually building their skill ability. With three runs under their belts, the 15 competitors took a short lunch break while the course was reversed prior to the afternoon's activities. Thanks to the hard work of event director Ray Wingrave, the post-lunch runs began and cars were soon out on the track avoiding flags and gradually reducing their times. In the senior group, Rod Shaw (Mini) took first outright (as expected) from Peter Whitten (Subaru Legacy) and Cody Richards (Mk2 Escort). Gary Gourlay brought his Alfa Romeo into 4th spot. They were followed by Tom Costa (Toyota Echo), Jason Lenane (Proton), Ron Woodward in the venerable Datsun 1200), Ged Blum (Hyundai) and Rob Neilson in the newly-acquired Datsun Sunny.

The Under 18 category was hotly contested as usual despite there only being three entries – Josh Dowell (Hyundai), Matt Whitten (Subaru Legacy) and Jimi Wingrave who finished in that order. The sole Under 14 drivers were Tamzyn Dowell (Hyundai, 1st.) and newcomer Lachlan Mann (Alfa Romeo, 2nd.) It was pleasing to see the Juniors performing so well with their times improving as the day went on, however it's not all about driving flat out. While we encourage young drivers to drive as quickly as they can, it's wise to remember that a smooth drive avoiding all the flags is often faster than driving flat out.

Thanks to Ray Wingrave and his helpers for setting up the course on the Saturday and his organization on the day. Thanks also to the scorers and to the capable caterers who looked after our refreshment needs on the day. There's a fair gap until the next round on July 22 but that will give the track a chance to recover for another day of khanacross fun. Thanks to everyone who participated.




Wilby Motorsport Park is approximately 40 min NW of Wangaratta, 37 min N of Benalla.
